The College Emblem is so devised as to signify the utmost qualities that a student should acquire through right education for betterment of the self and society.

The Emblem depicts an open book at the centre flanked by two elephants. Below these, there is a lady with a lamp sitting on a lotus flower. To her background is a mountain from which a river descends.

THE OPEN BOOK

The open book symbolises that our students get the right knowledge from the College through Quality Education.

THE ELEPHANTS

The two elephants at the top signify the courage and strength that our students get through Academic, Physical and Spiritual Education offered by the College.

THE LAMP

The Lamp in the hands of a lady indicates the enlightenment of mind and soul that our students get through the Human Excellence education. The lamp also symbolises the removal of ignorance. The lotus flower on which the lady rests indicates National Orientation of our College.

THE MOUNTAIN

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

To provide facilities for higher education for students from High Schools of Pollachi and Udumalpet Taluks, an organisation called “Pollachi Kalvi Kazhagam” with the following office bearers was constituted in 1957.

Thiru S.P. Nallamuthu Gounder – *President*

Thiru V.K. Palanisamy Gounder – *Vice-President*

Thiru M.S. Palaniappa Mudaliar – *Treasurer*

Dr. N. Mahalingam – *Secretary*

Thiru S.A. Ramachandran – *Asst. Secretary*

The organisation took efforts to establish a College in Pollachi. Thiru C. Subramaniam, former Minister for Finance evinced keen interest in this venture.

On the auspicious day of 12th July 1957 the College was inaugurated in the immediate presence of the Chief Donor Thiru S.P. Nallamuthu Gounder and started functioning with a strength of 160 students in the Pre-University Course. The able guidance and patronage of Arutchelvar Dr. N. Mahalingam, D.Sc., F.I.E., enabled the management to start degree courses in Economics, Mathematics and Physics in July 1959. Under Dr. N. Mahalingam's benevolent patronage, the College has now blossomed into a full-fledged academic institution offering UG and PG courses in various disciplines.

In July 1960, the Science Block was opened by the then Governor of Madras. B.Sc. , Degree course in Chemistry was started in July 1965 and B.Com. in July 1968. The B.A. Degree course in English Literature was introduced in July 1971. Degree courses in B.A. History and B.Sc. Botany were introduced in July 1972.

In September 1972, the “Pollachi Kalvi Kazhagam” was renamed as “Nallamuthu Gounder Mahalingam College Kalvi Kazhagam”.

A new block was constructed with the U.G.C. grant and it was opened by Thiru N.D. Sundaravadivelu, the then Vice-Chancellor of

Madras University on 3rd March 1974. The College began to spread its wings of progress with the introduction of co-education in the year 1975. Semester system was introduced in 1976.

The introduction of the Post-Graduate Course in Mathematics in 1979 was a great leap forward, followed by the P.G. Course in Physics in 1980 and Commerce in 1981. The B.Sc., Degree in Zoology was introduced in 1982.

The Silver Jubilee of the institution was celebrated in all splendour in February 1984. Hon'ble Sri P. Ramachandran, the then Governor of Kerala, inaugurated the spectacular celebrations, paid rich tributes to the College for its glorious achievements in the field of higher education and laid the Foundation stone for the Silver Jubilee Block. The magnificent building was completed. The B.Sc. Degree course in Computer Science was introduced in 1986.

The College has achieved greater academic distinctions with the introduction of autonomous system from the academic year 1987-88. Under autonomy, courses have been restructured and syllabi are designed to make the higher education more progressive and purposeful. In order to make the degree courses job-oriented a few disciplines such as B.Sc. (Physics), B.A. (Economics) and B.Com. were vocationalised in 1994.

The following Self-financing courses were started over the years:

B.Com. in 1982; M.C.A. (Master of Computer Applications) in 1990; B.B.M., and B.Sc., Computer Science in 1996; B.Sc., Mathematics in 1999; B.C.A., B.Com. C.A., in 2000 and M.A. English in 2001.

M.I.B. and M.A. Tamil, programmes were started in 2002.

Post Graduate Diploma in Business Administration was started in 2003. and B.A. Tamil in 2004. Additional Section in

B.Com. (CA), B.Sc., Information Technology in 2008, B.Com., E-Com. & MSW in 2009, B.A. English Literature, B.Com Finance & M.Sc. Computer Science in 2010. B.Sc C.T. & M.Com CA in 2011. B.Com Professional Accounting and Banking Insurance in 2012. B.Com Business Process Service in 2014. M.Sc. Chemistry and M.Sc. Botany in 2015. B.Com. International Business in 2017. B.Sc., Computer Science with DA, B.Sc., Computer Science with AI & ML, B.S.W in 2022.

The Centenary of our Founder Thiru S.P. Nallamuthu Gounder was celebrated with all splendour and colour on 27th January 1998.

Imparting Education is a divine phenomenon and it becomes more divine when a temple is present in an educational institution. Under the able guidance of the Patron Arutchelvar Dr. N. Mahalingam and the then College Secretary Thiru S.K. Kalyanasundaram, a beautiful temple for the God of Gods Sri Maha Vidya Ganapathy and God of Gurus Sri Viyakiana Dhakshinamoorthy was constructed. The Mahakumbabhisekam of the temple was performed on 15.3.2001.

In order to cope with the increasing demand for additional class rooms for various courses started afresh, a new mega building comprising MCA and UG computer centres and class rooms was constructed in the southern region of the College and the same was declared open on 2.11.2001 by our President Arutchelvar Dr. N. Mahalingam. Our Vice-President Dr. B.K. Krishnaraj Vanavarayar, Dr. S.V. Chittibabu, Former Vice-Chancellor, Annamalai University, Rev. Dr. S. Ignacimuthu, Vice-Chancellor, Dr. K.P. Kandasami, Registrar, Bharathiar University, Dr. G. Gopal, J.D. of Collegiate Education, Coimbatore, inaugurated various sections of the Computer Centres.

In order to foster Biotechnology Education and Research in this area of Tamilnadu, a separate world class Biotechnology Block was designed and constructed under the able guidance of the

then Secretary Thiru S.K. Kalyanasundaram. The College celebrated the Sathabhishekam of our beloved Arutchelvar Dr. N. Mahalingam on 11.4.2003. To commemorate this momentous event Computer Science Block was christened as Dr. Mahalingam Centre for Research and Development (MCRD) Block and the same was declared open by Dr. K. Kulandaivel, the then Chancellor, Avinashilingam Deemed University, Coimbatore in the presence of the then Vice-President, Dr. B.K. Krishnaraj Vanavarayar, and the then Treasurer Dr. S. Murugaiyan. A new block christened as Thiru. S.P. Krishnaswamy Gounder Science Block was dedicated to the Students by the Patron Dr. N. Mahalingam on 16.09.2005 to accommodate few science classes. Local Area Network (LAN) with Internet Connectivity in all the buildings and staff rooms was inaugurated on the same day by Dr. S. Murugaiyan. The year 2007 was the most important year for the College because the College got accredited and was awarded with 'A' Grade by NAAC in March 2007 and the college got Re-accredited and was awarded with 3.33 CGPA with 'A' Grade by NAAC in March 2013. Many landmarks were achieved during the year 2007 and these include, inauguration of Sri M.S. Palaniappa Mudaliar Block, Prof. M. Alkondan A/c Hall, Two Internet Centres, Language Laboratory, Virtual class room and Modernised Library with Digital Library. In order to conduct Yoga classes for Human Excellence Course, a new modernised hall christened Bharathiar Arangam was opened in 2008. To conduct various academic meetings a new A/c hall with all modern facilities was constructed and named as Vivekanandar Arangam in 2009.

Unveiling the statue of the Founder Amaram S.P. Nallamuthu Gounder was held on 20th July 2009. The Patron of our College Arutchelvar Dr. N. Mahalingam unveiled the statue in the presence of the President of our College Dr. B.K. Krishnaraj Vanavarayar.

To Keep pace with the expansion of the college, a new wing was constructed for the library measuring 8000 sq.ft and the present Library has been modernised with all modern facilities. The entire Library Block is dedicated to the fond memory of former Finance Minister of India Dr. C. Subramaniam and it was rechristened as Bharat Ratna C. Subramaniam Centenary Library and the same was inaugurated by our beloved Patron Arutchelvar Dr. N. Mahalingam on 21.12.2009. The Rotary Club of Pollachi conferred “Meritorious Service Award” on our College on 20.06.2010 considering its distinguished service in the field of education since 1957. UGC Funded Indoor stadium was thrown open to students in 2013. Flood lit Basket Ball Court was constructed. In Commemoration of Diamond Jubilee Celebration the youth Icon of India Swami Vivekananda Statue was unveiled by our college students on 28th June 2017. Srimath Swami Yathunathananthar, Ramakrishna Mission, Chennai delivered a speech on Swami Vivekananda. President of our College Dr. B.K. Krishnaraj Vanavarayar presided over the function on this auspicious occasion in the presence of our college Secretary Thiru M. Balasubramaniam and Treasurer Thiru S. Sivakumar.

The College introduced **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** in the Academic year **2004 - 2005**. From **2008-09** onwards our college has been following **new CBCS** in line with the instructions given by Tamilnadu State Government, TANSCH and Bharathiar University with the following objectives.

- + To provide the option to choose **courses of study** by students themselves.
- + To allot **credit points** to each paper of study according to the weightage of teaching and learning experience.
- + To expand the **horizon of knowledge** of students by means of Core, Inter disciplinary, Value-Based Education, Foundation courses and Diploma courses.
- + To allow the fast learners to earn **extra credits** from advanced courses.

- + To maintain the total credit points of each programme on par with International standards.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009. (under Section 26 (1)(g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956)

WARNING ON RAGGING

The Tamilnadu Prohibition of Ragging Act No.7 of 1997 is in force and hence Ragging is prohibited inside and outside the College. Those who get involved directly or indirectly in Ragging by any means such as teasing, abusing, playing practical jokes etc., causing physical and mental annoyance will be dismissed immediately from the College. The following punishments will be given to those who indulge in ragging:

Punishments for Ragging

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
5. Withholding results.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other Institution.
10. Fine up to Rs.2,50,000/-.
11. Rigorous imprisonment upto seven years.

While the first 10 types of punishment can be awarded by the appropriate authority of the institution itself, the last punishment can be awarded only by a court of law.

Types of Ragging

Punishments

Verbal Ragging	: 1 year imprisonment or fine or both.
Severe Verbal Ragging	: 7 years imprisonment with fine.
Physical Ragging	: 7 years imprisonment with fine.
Sexual Ragging	: 7 years rigorous imprisonment with fine.

GRIEVANCE REDRESS MODE

Any student who is having any grievance with respect to academic/personal matters can redress it by addressing to the Principal through his/her Tutor/HOD/Grievance redress committee or by directly meeting the Principal. Finance related grievances will be forwarded to the Secretary for redress. Students can also address their grievances to the Principal by dropping the appeal letter in the suggestion box kept in various points in the college.

ATTENDANCE

Students should earn 75% of attendance (67½ days) in every semester to eligible to appear for End-of Semester Examinations.

If a student is absent for more than 22½ days, in a semester, the Principal can condone the shortage of attendance on valid reasons up to a maximum of 10% (i.e. 9 days) and for this the students have to pay the condonation fee.

Those students who fail to earn the attendance of 58½ days shall not be permitted to write the End of Semester Examination. However they will be permitted to go to the next semester where they have to compensate the previous semester's lack of attendance and then only they will be permitted to write both semesters' examinations.

Students absent for more than 45 days, will not be permitted to write the End of Semester Examinations and they will not be permitted to go to the next semester. In such a case the student has to rejoin that semester during which the lack of attendance has occurred.

The facility of compensating the lack of attendance will be given only once during the course of study and beyond that level the student has to re-join the course.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. No student should be absent from the College without leave.
2. Whenever it is possible, leave should be applied for in advance. When it is not possible, leave should be applied for on the first day of his/her return to the College.
3. All leave applications should be written in the prescribed form and dropped in the leave letter box.
4. The Principal shall insist on a medical certificate in the case of illness for a long period.
5. Absence without leave for any particular hour will be counted as absence for half-a-day.
6. The Principal may take appropriate disciplinary action in the case of continued violation of leave rules.

ID CARDS

Students must bring their Identity Cards daily to College and they must wear the ID Card while they are inside the campus.

CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

1. Every student shall wear clean and suitable clothing.
2. Every student shall greet the members of the Staff on his/her first meeting them for the day.
3. When a member of the Staff enters the class room, the students shall rise and remain till they are asked to be seated or till the staff member takes his/her seat.
4. No student shall leave the classroom or laboratory without the permission of the teacher.

5. Students are not permitted to stand in the corridor during the class hours.
6. Students who may have no class to attend in any particular period, may go to the Reading Room or may sit in any classroom that may be unoccupied but shall on no account disturb the class at work.
7. When attending public meeting and the functions in the College, students should be decently dressed. They should be polite and courteous to all, ready to oblige, respectful to seniors and should prove themselves lovers of good order and decent behaviour.
8. Regarding matters not specified above, students shall aim at conducting themselves in a manner thoroughly worthy of the College, and in harmony with the best traditions of Indian life and culture.
9. Smoking inside the College or Hostel premises, throwing about waste papers, defacing the wall and committing nuisance on the grounds are punishable offences.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATION (TNER)

1. No student who has been convicted in a Court of Law for disloyal activities or who has been detained under Defence of India Rules or Restriction and Detention Ordinance 1944, shall be admitted or readmitted into the College without the previous sanction of the Director of Collegiate Education.
2. Students should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.
3. Principal or other constituted College authorities may frame and issue from time to time the disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct, in and outside the College premises, for students on the rolls so far as such rules seem necessary to maintain the reputation of the College.
4. Principal or other constituted College authorities shall have full power to inflict the following punishments in the interest of the students or the institution concerned: fines, for forfeiture of term certificates, suspension and expulsion.

PROCTORIAL SYSTEM

The College has proctorial system to ensure periodical monitoring of the progress and attendance of each student of the College. Each member of the staff will be in - charge of twenty students whose classroom participation, examinations and behaviour will be under thorough scrutiny of the proctor. The proctor may request the parents to visit the campus for discussion about the academic performance of the student.

ABC CATEGORISATION

The students of NGM are categorized into A, B and C streams immediately after their entry into the College. ABC categorization is primarily done based on their previous and present academic performance along with other parameters of evaluation taken up by the faculty. This methodology is to vouch for the cause of students in elevating them to higher and performers by precisely honing their talents and nurturing them for a brilliant career and meaningful life. The wards are persistently monitored and evaluated by the teachers at the end of every semester.

Based on their performance, Departments resort to corrective measures. Slow learners are particularly taken care of and support is extended to them to raise to the next higher

stratum of categorization. The evaluators consider students with less than 50 marks as 'C' category and those between 50 and 74 marks as 'B' category and 'A' category students are those with 75 / 100 marks.

It is the solemn resolve and vision of the Management and Teachers to guide the students to reach higher levels of categorization. In this novel method, a teacher understands his/her wards holistically and works towards her/his upliftment. This exercise has paid rich dividends in the overall academic performance of the College.

RULES AND REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM AND EXAMINATIONS

The office of the Controller of Examination started functioning from 1987 when this college was conferred with autonomous status. Since then, Rules and Regulations are framed based on the recommendations of Boards of Studies, Standing Committee on Academic Affairs, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Academic Council, keeping in view that they must be student friendly while safeguarding the credibility of the Institution.

Blooms's Taxonomy - Question Standard Level (Academic Year - 2017-18 onwards)

Outcome Based Education (OBE) has been implemented from the academic year 2017 - 2018. In connections with this, we are following Bloom's Taxonomy for teaching, learning and evaluating process to improve the skill of the students.

Bloom's Taxonomy primarily provides instructions with a focus for developing their course learning objectives. It can be used to increase student understanding of the learning process. Teachers can understand the complex cognitive development and how lower-level skills build into higher-order thinking (Ee.G., recalling facts and comprehending previous problems allow the students to apply their experience to similar problems)

All **Question Paper** follows the given levels:

- **Base Level (Remembering and Understanding)**
- **Application Level (Applying)**
- **Advance Thinking Level (Analyzing, Evaluating and Creating)**

Choice-Based Credit System coupled with Grading, Innovative method of Curriculum and Evaluation:

This is a modern system introduced in Higher Educational Institutions to keep the curriculum relevant to the global demands and standards. Students are offered with a choice of Job-oriented courses, Elective Courses and courses for improving soft-skills. They can choose any course of their interest and need during the period of study and earn extra credits and certificates in addition to the Degree in their respective disciplines. In this College, Choice Based Credit System is followed from 2004 – 2005 academic year onwards.

Under this system, every subject is fixed with certain credit points, based on its content of knowledge, its application orientation as well as number of contact hours allotted. This is done after a thorough analysis of the content of each subject by the members of Board of Studies. Components of Curriculum and Particulars of Choice Based System applicable to the students admitted during the academic year 2008-2009 onwards in Under Graduate and Post Graduate Programmes, as prescribed by Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education (TANSCH) & Bharathiar University are given here:

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRACTICAL

CIA marks for the practical are awarded based on the performance of students in practical tests and observation note book & regularity.

CIA Practical Tests: For each practical, students should write one model practical test. The marks obtained in the test will be appropriately converted into marks allotted for the test component of CIA of the practical.

Observation notebook and regularity: The marks allotted for observation notebook & regularity are awarded based on the performance of students in writing procedure, results of the practical done during every practical class, regularity in attending practical class, which will be accounted based on the attendance maintained separately for practical class, and punctuality in the submission of observation notebook.

Submission of Record Note Books for Practical Examinations

Candidates appearing for practical examination should submit bonafide record note books prescribed for practical examinations. Otherwise, the candidates will not be permitted to appear for the practical examination.

END-OF-SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS (ESE)

A semester consists of a minimum of 90 days excluding the End-of-Semester Examination days.

End-of-Semester Examinations for all courses will be held at the end of the semester.

Passing minimum in each subject / course under UG programme is 40% (aggregate of CIA and ESE)

Passing minimum in each subject / course under PG programme is 50%. (aggregate of CIA and ESE)

Passing minimum in each subject / course under Career Oriented Programmes, Certificate Courses and Diploma courses is 40%.

REQUIREMENTS TO APPEAR FOR EXAMINATIONS

A candidate will be permitted to appear for the End-of-Semester Examination for any semester if

- (i) he/she secures not less than 75% of attendance.
- (ii) he/she earns a progress certificate of having satisfactorily completed the course of study prescribed in the subjects.
- (iii) his/her conduct has been satisfactory.

EXAMINATION & EVALUATION:

End-of-Semester theory Examinations for Part - I, Part - II core courses and allied courses and Part - IV courses, Job-oriented courses, Advanced Learners courses and Career oriented Programmes are held in November and April every academic year. Practical Examinations are conducted prior to the theory examinations. Time-table for examinations is displayed well in advance i.e. 20 days prior to the commencement of examination and the Hall tickets are issued to eligible students, 5 days before the commencement of examination.

Evaluation of Extension Activities

The student's performance will be examined by the Staff-in-charge of the extension activities mentioned in part V subjects, with the following parameters. Fifty marks shall be awarded per semester.

Total marks 50 (CIA only) will be allotted as follows:

10 marks for regularity of attendance.

30 marks for active participation in camps/games/special camps/representation in College/District/State/University activities.

5 marks for exemplary awards/certificates/prizes.

5 marks for other social components such as Blood Donation, Fine Arts etc.,

PROVISION FOR IMPROVEMENT

A student who passes current paper(s) can reappear for the same paper(s) in the succeeding End-of-Semester Examination only, for improving his/her marks. Re-appearance for improvement is allowed for theory and practical subjects of all semesters, except for the final semester subjects. Revised mark statement will be issued after withdrawing the previous one, if the marks obtained in improvement are higher than the marks secured earlier. When there is no improvement, there shall not be any change in the original marks already awarded. The improved marks shall be considered for classification but not for ranking.

RE-APPEARANCE FOR ARREAR SUBJECTS

Students who fail in the End-of-Semester Examinations can write arrear examinations to be held along with the subsequent regular End-of- Semester Examinations or separately.

RESTRICTIONS TO APPEAR FOR THE EXAMINATIONS:

Candidates who fail in any of the papers under Part I, II, III & IV of the UG End-of-Semester Examinations and Core & Elective papers of the PG End-of-Semester examinations shall complete the paper concerned within 5 years from the date of admission to the particular courses. If they fail to do so, they shall take the examination in the texts/revised regulations/ syllabus of the paper prescribed for the subsequent batch of candidates, in force at the time of their

reappearance. In the event of the removal of that paper consequent to change of regulation and / or curriculum after 5-year period, the candidate shall have to take up an equivalent paper in the revised syllabus as suggested by the Chairman, Board of Studies concerned.

PROVISION FOR RE-TOTALLING, REVALUATION AND OBTAINING PHOTOCOPY OF VALUED ANSWER SCRIPTS

UG candidates may apply for re-totalling/revaluation/photocopy of valued answer scripts, to the Controller of Examinations through the Heads of Departments and Principal, in the prescribed forms, remitting the prescribed fee within 10 days from the date of publication of results. Revaluation/obtaining photocopy of answer scripts is permissible for the current semester papers and for any arrear paper.

Those who wish to apply for the revaluation of final semester papers can do so within five days from the date of publication of results.

Revised mark statement will be issued after withdrawing the previous one, if the marks obtained in revaluation/retotalling are higher than the marks obtained earlier. In other cases, the original marks obtained earlier will be retained and the matter will be intimated to the student concerned as “No change”.

A candidate who applies for revaluation need not apply for retotalling.

Candidates, who desire to apply for revaluation after obtaining photocopy of the valued answer scripts, can do so within 7 days from the date of receipt of the photocopy, remitting the prescribed fee for revaluation.

SPECIAL SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION

In order to provide an opportunity for the final UG and PG students to complete the programmes in the same year itself and help them vertical mobility, special supplementary End-of-Semester Examinations will be conducted in about 20 days from the date of publication of results every year for the candidates who fail by only one paper of the Six semesters. Students, who wish to apply for special supplementary End-of-Semester Examinations, can do so within 7 days from the date of publication of results.

The examination fee for special supplementary examination will be three times that of the regular fee per theory paper/practical.

INFORMATION REGARDING EXAMINATIONS

For the Candidates who have completed the duration of the course and left the College, all information regarding Regular and Supplementary Examinations, results, issue of certificates and application for Graduation will be available in the College website www.ngmc.org and general notice board of the College. Regular students will however be informed of the examinations by circulation, in addition to the modes mentioned above. No candidate will be individually communicated.

RULES

1. The Library and the Reading room are open to all the members of the College.
2. Each student will be supplied with TWO TICKETS at the beginning of the academic year. Penalty for the loss of a ticket is Rs. 25/- and the student will be held responsible for the book borrowed on it. No book will be lent unless the ticket is handed over to the Librarian. The ticket should be surrendered to the Library on leaving the College.
3. Students will be entitled to keep two books for two weeks from the date of issue. At the end of the period books are to be returned to the Library, on the date marked on the slips. But they may be re-issued to the same person, if they are not in the meantime applied for. When re-issued, the books may be retained for a further period of one week and not more than two such renewals will be allowed. The books should be produced before the Librarian for renewals.
4. The Librarian may recall any book at any time even if the normal period of loan has not expired.
5. A student failing to return a book on the due date will be fined for each day of delay, Sunday and other holidays being excluded.
6. A student who has to pay fine or any other charge to the Library will not be allowed to borrow books.
7. Absence from College will not be ordinarily accepted as an excuse for delay in the return of books.
8. Reference books will not be lent out.
9. Students are expected to use all the books with care. If a book is lost or damaged the borrower has to replace the book or to pay the price of the book.

10. All marking or underlining or annotating of books whether already soiled or not is forbidden. Every book will be examined as soon as it is returned and if any book is found to have been marked, soiled or damaged, the matter will be reported to the Principal for disciplinary action.
11. The student who borrowed the book last shall be held responsible for all defects which he/she does not point out at the time of his/her taking it.
12. Every student who wishes to take a book shall fill in the application form and submit it to the Librarian before 10 a.m.
13. The students should return the books before 1 p.m. and books will be issued to them after 4 p.m.
14. The Library is open on all working days of the College from 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. The Library will remain closed on all Holidays.
15. The Library will be closed during vacation.
16. Strict silence and decorum should be observed in the Library, the Reading Room and at the Library Counter. The Librarian can refuse to issue books for breach of this rule. The Librarian shall bring to the notice of the Principal any student damaging the books, talking or making noise or appearing in the Library and the Reading Room improperly dressed or misbehaving in any other way.
17. All complaints and suggestions should in the first instance be made to the Librarian who will, if necessary, refer them to the Principal.
18. Students must return all the Library books at the end of the course or at the time of their leaving the College whichever is earlier. All dues should be paid.

RATHNASABAPATHY MEMORIAL HOSTEL (A HOME AWAY FROM HOME)**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Every student before allotment of a seat in the hostel shall give an undertaking with respect to the acceptance of rules and regulations along with the duly filled in general information form and immunization record.
2. Allotment of hostel seats will be for the full academic year. In case they want to leave the hostel in the middle of the academic year they should pay the hostel charges for the full academic year in one instalment.
3. It is the responsibility of the inmates to do their best for maintaining discipline, peace and harmony in the hostel. The senior students are advised to set good examples to their juniors.
4. Any activity of the inmates observed to be prejudicial and detrimental to the smooth and peaceful functioning of the college hostel will be viewed seriously by the management and disciplinary action will be taken against those found guilty.
5. Misuse of electricity, water and other facilities will be liable for penalty.
6. Hostel rooms and toilets must be kept clean and tidy. Photographs, pictures etc, shall not be pasted or displayed on the walls of the room.
7. Students shall report to the warden immediately after classes at 6.00 p.m. every day.
8. Inmates shall be allowed to attend phone calls between 5.00 p.m. and 9.00 p.m. The telephonic conversation is restricted to 5 minutes in order to facilitate all the inmates who want to make use of this facility.
9. Inmates shall strictly maintain silence in the hostel premises especially during the study hours.
10. Payment of hostel fees beyond the stipulated date will be liable for fine.
11. Inmates shall not keep money or other valuable items in their rooms. However they can hand over such items to the warden for safe custody and obtain an acknowledgment due to them.
12. Indoor games, cultural programmes, intra hostel cultural and sports programmes, monthly feast and hostel day etc, are some of the activities and special features of N.G.M. College hostel homes. Inmates are advised to avail themselves of this opportunity to the maximum extent.

15. The inmates are allowed to go home once in a month.
16. The visitors will not be allowed to meet the other hostel students except their wards.
17. The students leaving home on scheduled date should return to the hostel either on Sunday before 6.00 p.m. or Monday before 7.30 a.m. Any student reaching after the prohibited timings will not be entertained.
18. Students leaving home for the weekend should get the weekend slips from their parents without fail.
19. Students should pay their mess bill and respective payments on or before the scheduled date. Any delay will have to be accompanied with penalty. Last date for the mess bill is 5th of every month.
20. Parents are requested not to disturb their wards during the working days except on any serious or important occasions.
21. Cell phones are strictly prohibited inside the hostel and in the college.
